Text, captions and captions with image references included must be submitted in separate files. Footnotes must be consecutively numbered and located at the bottom of each page.

- **Languages**: English, French, German or Italian with a <u>250 word abstract</u> in English. Please note that authors are responsible for any language revision or correction of their contributions.
- Length: max. 5000 words (footnotes excluded)
- **Format**: use only Microsoft Word (.doc or .docx); Times New Roman, 12 pt, double-spaced (for text and footnotes) on A4 paper with the standard margins of your program; bold and italic typefaces are acceptable, but do not use underlines
- The text shall contain the following information: Title of the paper,
 Name(s) of the author(s), their institutional affiliation and email;
 Abstract in English
- **Style sheet:** Please follow the guidelines for contributors to publications of the German Archaeological Institute (DAI): https://www.dainst.org/en/research/publications/publishing-at-the-dai/dai-citation-style-and-abbreviations
- **Bibliography**: use the short citation system (Author-Date style) and provide a complete bibliography separately

Images

Please provide all images as separate data files and don't place them in the text.

- Maximum 8 (eight) images, .tif or .eps format
- Digital vector graphics (images created in Adobe Illustrator, AutoCAD, etc.) need to be submitted as high-resolution export files: tif or .eps.
 Please notice that the minimal line width for the final print format is 0.3 points.
- Size: grayscale (8 bit) or color (CMYK) images: min. 400 dpi; drawings (non-vector black-and-white line drawings): min. 1200 dpi



- Photographs should be formatted in grayscale, color pictures should be the exception which will have to be specifically accepted by the editorial board
- Indicate the placement of the images in your text
- Provide a separate list of illustration captions
- Copyright and authorization permissions must be obtained without exception by the author.
